Wuhan operations

- Air: Airport is open for international flights, however only for charter services and limited carriers are allowed to land (landing right purpose).
- Sea: Wuhan port and terminal are open, feeder services are still under recovery.

Rail: Rail terminals are open and almost back to normal but space is challenging due to high demand.

China in general

• Air: Civil Aviation Administration of China (CAAC) limits incoming and outgoing passenger flights to a maximum of one per airline per foreign country each week, effective from March 29, further restraining belly capacity.

Malaysia

- Operational with limitations
- The country is now in the fourth phase of the Movement Control Order (MCO) which is in place until May 12, however the government imposed the fifth phase, a Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO), until June 9 which allowed most of the businesses to reopen.
- DACHSER Malaysia continues to operate and the air and sea logistics sector is slowly picking up.

India Subcontinent

Bangladesh

- Operational with limitations
- All government and private offices including DACHSER Bangladesh are closed until May 16, our teams are working from home.
- Air freight: Due to the mass cancellation of passenger flights, freight capacity is severely restricted resulting in delays and an increase in transit time.
- Sea freight: The Chittagong port is finally drifting away from a standstill as the congestion both at the terminals and the outer anchorage is clearing up. Average berthing delay has come down to 8 days from 16 days.



India

• Operational with limitations

- The lockdown across India has been extended for the third time and will now continue until May 17. The central government is allowing private offices to operate with 33% of the normal workforce excluding the offices in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region and Pune, this is due to a significant increase of cases in these areas.
- Most of the DACHSER India branches are having skeleton staffing on-site while the offices in Mumbai and Pune remains closed with staff working remotely to assist customers via regular communication such as e-mail and phone.
- All passenger flights remain suspended until May 17; cargo flights are operating with limited operations to/from India.
- Domestic transportation are permitted across the country, however shortage of drivers is still prevailing.
- Import and export shipments to and from India are possible provided that the shipper has confirmation from the local DACHSER India office.
